- ◆ The College aims to generate internal resource and its mobilization to ensure sustainable development.



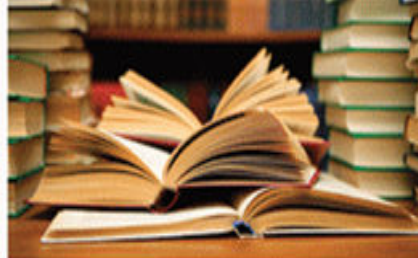

All admission to Higher Secondary Courses shall be strictly on merit and subject to AHSEC regulations.



Eligibility

A candidate must have passed the 10th class examination from a recognised board/ council.

Note:

1. A candidate seeking admission under the above quota must submit **self attested** copy of the certificate from the competent authority with photograph duly signed across by the candidate at the time of interview/ admission.

2. Fee concession for **two HS** (one in Arts & one in Science) and **two UG** (one in Arts & one in Science) meritorious students will be granted belonging to economically backward class along with *college uniform*. Such students have to apply separately to the Admission Committee with documentary evidence of their BPL status.

3. Department of Sanskrit offers **Fee Concession** to the students who select Sanskrit as a subject (UG and HS level).

Self-financing subjects

There are two self-financing subjects in H. S. Arts i.e. **Sociology** and **Education**. Any candidate wants to opt for Education and Sociology has to pay Rs. 4000/- (Rs. Four Thousand only) per subject as self financing course fee for each year.




Admission Procedure



1. Advertisement for admission to different Courses are published in the college website as well as newspapers in Assam.
2. Application Forms & Prospectus can be downloaded directly from the College website www.dhsk.org.
3. An applicant willing to apply for more than one CORE subject in the undergraduate (B. A., B. Sc.) course, must apply using the options available in choosing the next CORE subjects.
4. Filled in Application Forms are to be submitted online by visiting the College website.
5. The list of selected applicants for admission will be uploaded in the college website in due course.

The selected applicants will have to complete the admission procedure by paying the admission fees in the ONLINE MODE only in the dates and time fixed by the college. If anyone fails to fulfill the process, the selection will be cancelled and no claim will be entertained.

6. Self-attested copies of **mark sheet** and **pass certificate** of the last qualifying examination wherever applicable are to be submitted at the time of interview/admission if the **ADMISSION IS OFFLINE**.
7. A candidate will be admitted provisionally subject to production of original documents at the stipulated time notified by the college authority after commencement of classes, if the **ADMISSION IS ONLINE**.
8. A candidate seeking admission under the reserved quota (Cast, Sports, NCC etc.) must submit a self-attested copy of the relevant certificate in support of his / her claim at the time of interview/admission.
9. Original Documents required for verification:
 - (i) Admit card of H.S.L.C./ H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
 - (ii) Mark sheets of H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
 - (iii) Pass Certificates of H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
 - (iv) Other relevant Certificate (Caste, Sports, NCC etc.) if applicable.
10. Candidates having **Gap Period** must submit an affidavit for the gap period (on stipulated time frame to be notified by the college authority). **However, any student having passed the qualifying examination in 2018 or earlier, shall not be considered for admission.**
11. Admission will take place on the notified date/time only. The web link will be closed after the stipulated time period.
12. The actual fee for admission will be fixed as per government directive(s) and it will be notified in the college website in due course.
13. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, ONLINE classes will be conducted and it is mandatory for every applicant to have his/her OWN Phone Number, OWN e-mail ID and a suitable device. (In no case, parents' Phone number and e-mail ID(s) will be applicable.).
14. Applicants seeking Hostel (Boys' & Girls') accomodation have to apply seperately for Hostel admission and if selected, can take Hostel Admission on the date of admission.
15. Furnishing any kind of false documents shall invite legal action.



Identity Card

An Identity Card will be issued to each student by the college. In the event of loss or damage of a card, a duplicate one will be issued from the office of the Principal on payment of Rs. 500.00 (Five hundred) only for the same. Students **must display** their **Identity Cards** on their person in the **college campus**.

After admission (VERY IMPORTANT)

1. Every student shall download the Application notified by the office from App Store and register himself/herself using the same Phone number and e-mail as provided in the APPLICATION FORM, so as to be accessible to the ONLINE Classes.
2. Every student must routinely submit the report of attending classes(Online/Offline) and other activities related to the teaching and learning process through online DIARY provided to them.
3. Every student must submit a feedback on teacher(s), facilities and other relevant activities through online App. provided to them.
4. Every student must obey the HEALTH PROTOCOL issued by the Government.

General code of conduct

1. Students shall be responsible for their conducts in the college and are prohibited from doing anything (either inside or outside the campus), that will amount to a breach of discipline, or cause of interference in the discipline and normal functioning of the college.
2. Students shall take proper care of the furniture, equipments, premises and all properties.
3. **Ragging** in any form in the college is strictly prohibited and any student found indulging in such activity shall invite disciplinary and legal action.
4. The students must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the College Authority.
5. All kinds of **toxicants** are strictly prohibited inside the college campus.
6. Punitive measure will be initiated against a student of the college if he/she uses the platform of **Social Media** to abuse/ scold/afront students/ faculty members/others and he/she will face **Legal Action**.
7. A student having two wheeler must have **Driving License**. They will not be allowed to enter the College Campus without **Helmet** and relevant documents of their vehicle.

Attendance Rules

- Every student is required to attend all classes (lectures /tutorials /practical).
- A student must have 75% attendance to be eligible as a regular candidate to appear in the H. S. Final examinations.
- A student who attends 60% of the classes shall however be allowed to appear in the examination as non collegiate candidate on payment of a prescribed non-collegiate fee. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the H.S. examination with attendance below 60% in theory classes.
- A student must attend all practical classes and perform all experiments as required under the regulations of the AHSEC.
- A student who attends less than 80% of the classes shall not be allowed to appear in the election of the Students' Union.

Undergraduate Courses

Arts and Science



Dibrugarh University has introduced Choice Based Credit System in Under Graduate level (B. A. & B. Sc.) from the academic session 2019-2020. As an affiliated college, DHSK College also offering the same in B. A. & B. Sc. Courses.

Key words:

a) **CBCS:** CBCS means Choice Based Credit System is a flexible system of learning. There is a College CBCS Board to monitor and supervision of CBCS.

This system permits students to -

- learn at their own pace
- choose electives from a wide range of Elective Courses offered for the programme
- undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required number of credits
- adopt an inter-disciplinary approach in learning
- make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

b) **Programme:** The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses in a particular field of study.

c) **Course:** A Programme is divided into a number of courses. A course is a unit of instruction or segment of subject area under any programme. The traditional concept 'paper' is replaced by 'course'.

d) **Academic Year:** An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.

e) **Semester:** The word *semester* is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.

f) **Semester Duration:** A semester normally extends over a period of 15 class weeks. Each week has 30 hours of instruction spread over the week.

g) **In-semester:** The word *in-semester* is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.

h) **End-semester:** The word *end-semester* is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.

i) **Credit:** 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/ syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the course, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14-15 week schedule:

- i) 1 Lecture per week = 1 Hour duration per week = 1 Credit
- ii) 1 Tutorial per week = 1 Hour duration per week = 1 Credit
- iii) 1 Practical per week = 2 Hours duration per week = 1 Credit

j) Participating in various curricular and co-curricular activities as and when necessary.

Semester Duration:

- i) **Odd Semesters:** June–November (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
- ii) **Even Semester:** December–May (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)

Academic Schedule:

The Academic Schedule of the Bachelor degrees in Arts (BA) and Science (B.Sc.) Programmes under the CBCS shall be administered as per the Academic Calendar of the University published for every academic session.

Admission Criteria:

Minimum eligibility in to UG Programmes shall be as follows:

a. Bachelor of Arts (B.A.): A student passed the HS Examination (10+2) of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

For admission into the BA in Economics Honours, a candidate should have preferably passed the HS Examination (10+2) of the AHSEC or an equivalent examination with passing Mathematics as a subject.

An Important Note: In case a student of Economics Honours, have not pursued and passed Mathematics in the HS level; he/ she shall have to opt an Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course of Mathematics of 2 credits.

b. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.): A student passed the HS Examination (10+2) in Science stream of the AHSEC, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

An Important Note: For admission into the B.Sc. in Chemistry and Physics Honours, a candidate must pass the HS Examination (10+2) in Science stream of the AHSEC or an equivalent examination with passing Mathematics as a subject.

Reservation Policy: Statutory reservation policy of the government shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

Course Structure:

1. The Course Structure of the Academic Programmes under the CBCS shall be as per the Course Structure given in **Annexure I**. The nature of the Courses for all UG Academic programmes shall be as below:

a) Core Courses:

Compulsory components of an Academic Programme: These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme.

b) Elective Courses:

Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental, i.e., Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure.

There shall be a basket of at least eight Elective Courses having equal number of credits. For the students of the same discipline/ subjects these elective courses shall be intra-disciplinary.

c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds – ‘Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses’ and ‘Skill Enhancement Courses’. These courses shall be inter-disciplinary (within the Programme) in nature.

i. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

- (a) Environmental Science (2 Credit)
- (b) Communicative English (2 Credit)
- (c) Alternative English/Communicative Hindi /MIL (2 Credit).

For BA Programme, there shall be a Multi-disciplinary Course of 4 Credits.

ii. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (minimum 4 credits):

These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/fieldwork.

The List of Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are given as **Annexure I**.

A Course may also take the form of a Dissertation/ Project work/ Practical training/ Field work/ Seminar etc.

Change of Course:

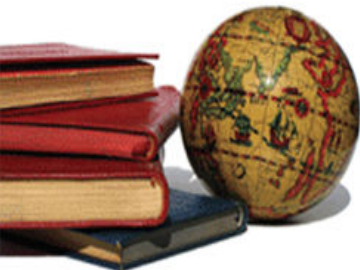
- If a student seeking permission for change subject(s) *after admission*, he/ she should apply to the principal. In such cases, he/she have to pay the requisite fee fixed by the college.
- Change of Courses /Subject shall not be permitted *after registration*.

Attendance

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination.

The College office will notify the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the End-semester examinations.

Annexure II

Rules for Internal Assessment in B.A./B.Sc. Programmes

1. The marks allotted for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on the following:

- a) Sessional Examination I & II (Written): 25% each of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
- b) Seminar/ Group Discussion: 25 % of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
- c) Attendance: 25 % of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

2. If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned. The college shall notify the same prior to filling up forms for examinations.



P.G. PROGRAMME IN ENGLISH LITERATURE

DHSK College offers Post Graduate Programme in English Literature which is completely self-financing under Dibrugarh University (CBCS mode).

- **Number of seats: 20**

- The Programme duration shall be of four Semesters, with each semester consisting of four courses.
- Each course is of 100 marks. Out of that 40 marks is allocated for Internal Assessment and 60 marks is for end Semester Examination.
- A Candidate passing the TDC examination with a minimum of 60% marks can apply for admission into the course.

P.G. PROGRAMME IN MATHEMATICS and ANTHROPOLOGY

DHSK College offers Post Graduate programme in Mathematics and Anthropology which is completely self-financing.

These courses are affiliated to Assam Science and Technology University (ASTU), Guwahati, Assam.

- **Number of seats in Mathematics: 30**

- **Number of seats in Anthropology: 20**

- The Programme duration is of four Semesters.
- Each course is of 100 marks. Out of that 40 marks is allocated for Internal Assessment and 60 marks is allocated for end Semester Examination.
- A Candidate passing the TDC examination with a minimum of 60% marks in relevant subject can apply for admission into the courses.



Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)

DHSK College offers BCA programme under Dibrugarh University which is completely self-financing.

- Number of seats: 40

BCA is a professional course to impart theoretical as well as technical knowledge of Computer Science. The course is conducted under CBCS mode. In DHSK College it is conducted as a **self financing course**. The fee is fixed by the College authority from time to time to run the course. The department is housed in a newly constructed building with all modern facilities. Staff Room and Class Rooms are well equipped with projectors and AC. At present the computer laboratory has 20 number of computers with high configurations such as i5 etc. The department organises guest lectures and hands on training programmes every year. After graduation a student may be absorbed in the IT sector or may be self employed.

A candidate passed H.S (10+2) or any equivalent qualifying examination as recognised by the GoI and GoA with pass marks in **Mathematics** can apply for the course.

- The Programme consists of Six Semesters, with each semester consisting of five courses.

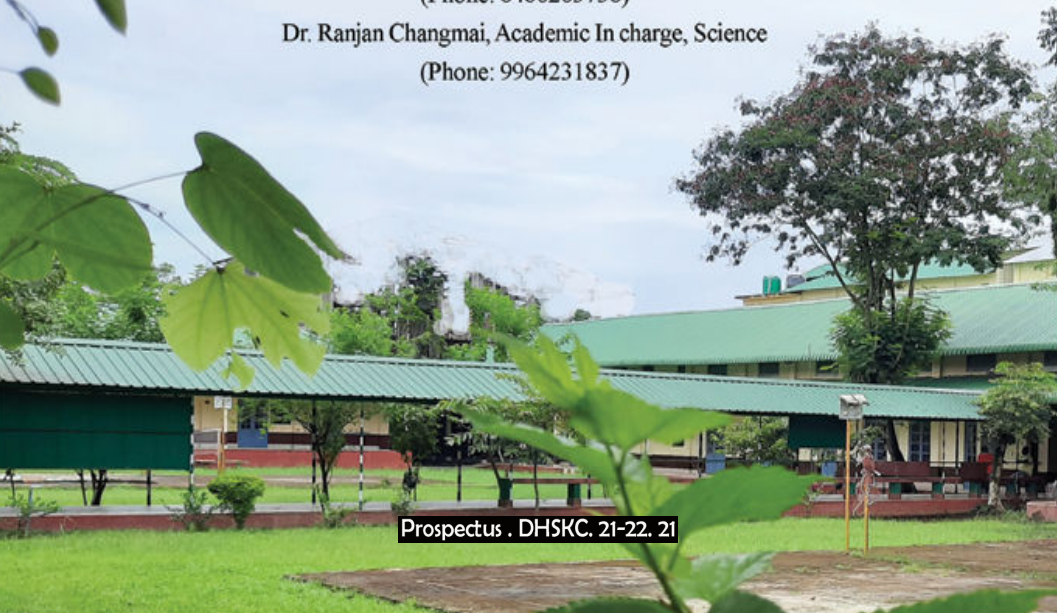
