The College is promoting computerization in the basic operational activities and use of modern technologies.



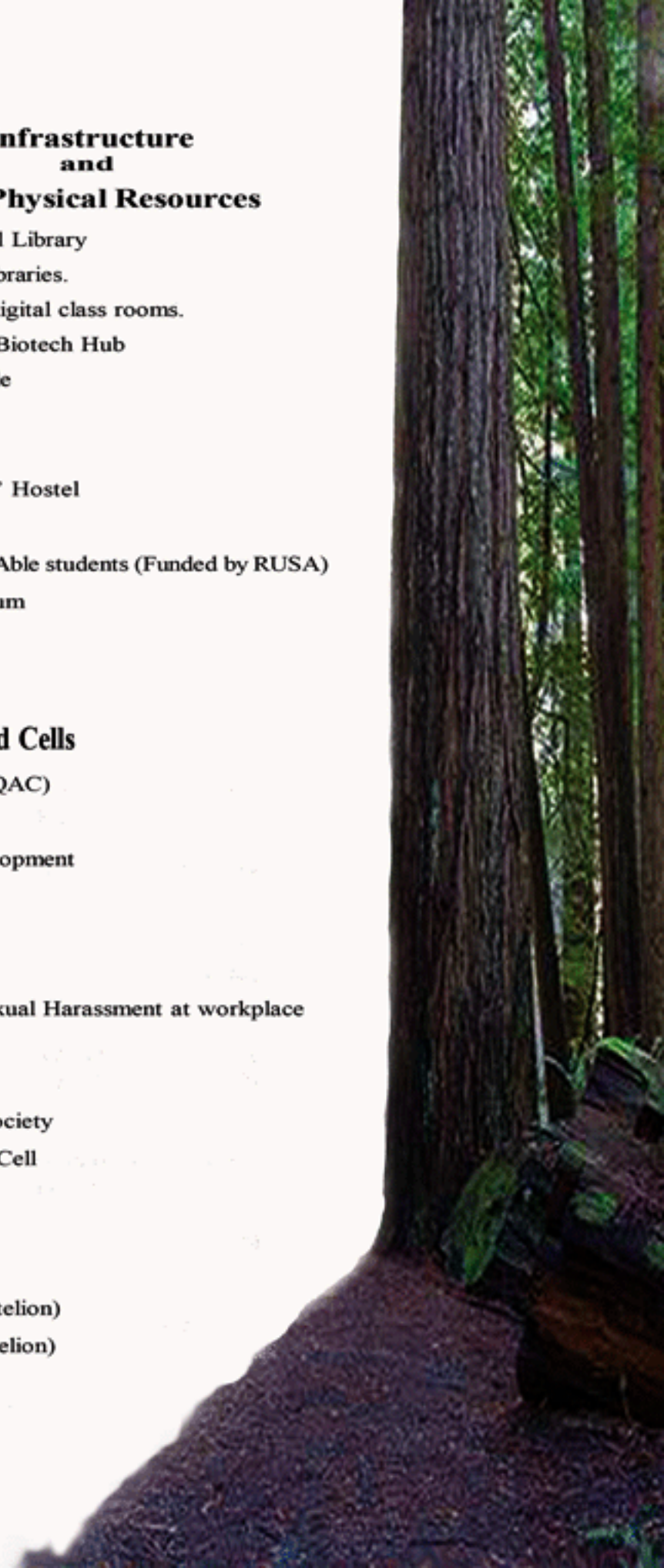

## (Arts and Science)



Dibrugarh University introduces Choice Based Credit System in Under Graduate level (B. A. & B. Sc) from the academic session 2019-2020. As an affiliated college, DHSK College is introducing the same in B. A. & B. Sc. from the coming session.

### Key words:

a) **CBCS:** CBCS means Choice Based Credit System is a flexible system of learning. There is a College CBCS Board to monitor and supervision of CBCS.

This system permits students to

- learn at their own pace
- choose electives from a wide range of Elective Courses offered for the programme
- undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required number of credits
- adopt an inter-disciplinary approach in learning
- make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

b) **Programme:** The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses in a particular field of study.

c) **Course:** A Programme is divided into a number of courses. A course is a unit of instruction or segment of subject area under any programme. The traditional concept 'paper' is replaced by 'course'.

d) **Academic Year:** An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.

e) **Semester:** The word *semester* is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.

f) **Semester Duration:** A semester normally extends over a period of 15 class weeks. Each week has 30 hours of instruction spread over the week.

g) **In-semester:** The word *in-semester* is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.

h) **End-semester:** The word *end-semester* is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.

i) **Credit:** 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/ syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the course, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14-15 week schedule:

- i) 1 Lecture per week = 1 Hour duration per week =1 Credit
- ii) 1 Tutorial per week = 1 Hour duration per week =1 Credit
- iii) 1 Practical per week = 2 Hours duration per week =1 Credit

j) Participating in various curricular and co-curricular activities as and when necessary.

**Semester Duration:**

- i) **Odd Semesters:** June –November (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
- ii) **Even Semester:** December -May (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)

**Academic Schedule:**

The Academic Schedule of the Bachelor degrees in Arts (BA) and Science (B.Sc.) Programmes under the CBCS shall be administered as per the Academic Calendar of the University published for every academic session.

**Admission Criteria:**

Minimum eligibility in to UG Programmes shall be as follows:

**a. Bachelor of Arts (B.A.):** A student passed the HS Examination (10+2) of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

For admission into the BA in Economics Honours, a candidate should have preferably passed the HS Examination (10+2) of the AHSEC or an equivalent examination with passing Mathematics as a subject.

**An Important Note:** In case a student of Economics Honours, have not pursued and passed Mathematics in the HS level; he/ she shall have to opt an Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course of Mathematics of 2 credits.

**b. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.):** A student passed the HS Examination (10+2) in Science stream of the AHSEC, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.

**An Important Note:** For admission into the B.Sc. in Chemistry and Physics Honours, a candidate must pass the HS Examination (10+2) in Science stream of the AHSEC or an equivalent examination with passing Mathematics as a subject.

**Reservation Policy:** Statutory reservation policy of the government shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

**Course Structure:**

1. The Course Structure of the Academic Programmes under the CBCS shall be as per the Course Structure given in **Annexure I**. The nature of the Courses for all UG Academic programmes shall be as below:

**a) Core Courses:**

Compulsory components of an Academic Programme: These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme.

**b) Elective Courses:**

Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental, i.e., Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure.

There shall be a basket of at least eight Elective Courses having equal number



of credits. For the students of the same discipline/ subjects these elective courses shall be intra-disciplinary.

**c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):**

The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds – ‘Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses’ and ‘Skill Enhancement Courses’. These courses shall be inter-disciplinary (within the Programme) in nature.

**i. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):**

- (a) Environmental Science (2 Credit)
- (b) Communicative English (2 Credit)
- (c) Alternative English/Communicative Hindi /MIL (2 Credit).

For BA Programme, there shall be a Multi-disciplinary Course of 4 Credits.

**ii. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): (minimum 4 credits):**

These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/fieldwork.

The List of Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are given as **Annexure II**.

A Course may also take the form of a Dissertation/ Project work/ Practical training/ Field work/ Seminar, etc.

**Change of Course:**

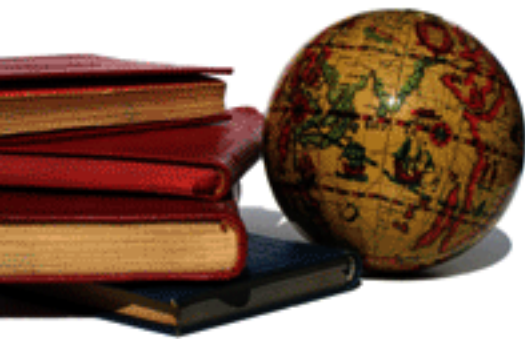
- If a student seeking permission for change subject(s) *after admission*, he/she should apply to the principal. In such cases, he/she have to pay the requisite fee fixed by the college.
- Change of Courses /Subject shall not be permitted *after registration*.

**Attendance**

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination.

The College office will notify the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the End-semester examinations.

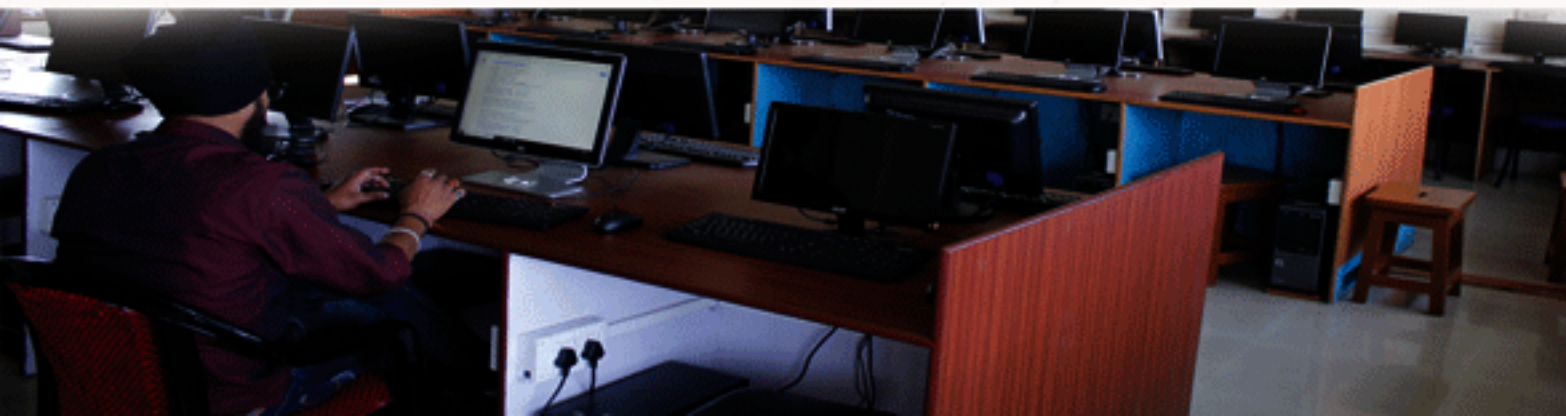

## Annexure II

### **Rules for Internal Assessment in B.A./B.Sc. Programmes**

1. The marks allotted for Internal Assessment (20% ) in each course shall be based on the following:
  - a) Sessional Examination I & II (Written): 25% each of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
  - b) Seminar/ Group Discussion: 25 % of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
  - c) Attendance: 25 % of the marks allotted for internal assessment.
2. If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned. The college shall notify the same prior to filling up forms for examinations.



# Post Graduate Programme in English Literature

The DHSK College offer a Post Graduate programme in English Literature which is completely self-financing.

- **Number of seats offered for the programme: 20**
- The PG Programme follows the MA syllabus prescribed by the Dibrugarh University under CBCS.
- The Programme duration shall be of four Semesters, with each semester consisting of four courses.
- Each course shall be of 100 marks and out of that 40 marks shall be allocated for Internal Assessment and the remaining 60 marks shall be allocated for end Semester Examination.
- A Candidate passing the TDC examination with a minimum of 60% marks can apply for admission into the course.

## **BCA: Eligibility Criteria for Admission**

The BCA programme of DHSK College under Dibrugarh University is in CBCS mode. The course is completely Self-Financing.

- A Candidate passing the 10+2 examination passed in **Mathematics** can apply for admission into **the BCA** course.
- The Programme duration shall be of Six Semesters, with each semester consisting of four courses.
- **Number of seats offered for the programme: 25**

### Note:

1. A candidate seeking admission under the above quota must submit **self attested** copy of the certificate from the competent authority with photograph duly signed across by the candidate at the time of interview/ admission.

2. Fee concession for **two HS** (one in Arts & one in Science) and **two UG** (one in Arts & one in Science) meritorious students will be granted belonging to economically backward class along with *college uniform*. Such students have to apply separately to the Admission Committee with documentary evidence of their BPL status.

3. Department of Sanskrit offers Fee Concession to the students who select Sanskrit as a subject (UG and HS level).



## Admission Procedure

1. Application Forms & Prospectus can be downloaded directly from the College website [www.dhsk.org](http://www.dhsk.org).
2. Applicants will have to pay an amount of 400.00 (Rs. Four hundred) only through SBI Collect at the time of submission of Application Form. (The detail about the procedure is available with the online application form.)
3. Filled in forms are to be submitted at the College website within the stipulated date and time to be notified in leading News Papers of Assam and college website.
4. Self-attested copies of **mark sheet** and **pass certificate** of the last qualifying examination wherever applicable are to be submitted at the time of interview/admission.
5. A candidate seeking admission under the reserved quota (Cast, Sports, NCC etc.) must submit a self-attested copy of the relevant certificate in support of his / her claim at the time of interview/admission.
6. Original Documents required for verification at the time of interview/admission:
  - (i) Admit card of H.S.L.C./ H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
  - (ii) Mark sheets of H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
  - (iii) Pass Certificates of H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C. or equivalent examinations.
  - (iv) Other relevant Certificate (Cast, Sports, NCC etc.) if applicable.
7. Candidates having **Gap Period** must submit an affidavit for the gap period at the time of interview/admission. **However, any student having passed the qualifying examination before 2018, shall not be considered for admission.**
8. Admission will take place on the notified date only.
9. Applicants seeking Hostel (Boys' & Girls') accomodation have to apply seperately for Hostel admission and if selected, can take Hostel Admission on the date of admission.
10. The fee (non refundable) will be collected for an academic year at the time of admission.
11. **Furnishing any kind of false documents shall invite legal action.**



### **Identity Card**

An Identity Card will be issued to each student by the college. In the event of loss or damage of a card, a duplicate one will be issued from the office of the Principal on payment of Rs. 300.00 (Three hundred) only for the same. Students **must display their Identity Cards** on their person in the **college campus**.

### **General code of conduct**

1. Students shall be responsible for their conduct to the college authority and are prohibited from committing any action (either inside or outside the campus), which will amount to a breach of discipline, or cause of interference in the discipline and normal function of the college.
2. Students shall take proper care of the furniture, equipments, premises and all properties.
3. Ragging in any form in the college is strictly prohibited and any student found indulging in such activity shall invite legal action.
4. The students must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the College Authority; otherwise will invite disciplinary action for the same.
5. **Mobile phones** are Strictly Prohibited inside the college campus. Principal, Vice Principal, Teachers and office staff have the right to check and cseize the mobile phone.
6. All kinds of **tobacco products** are strictly banned inside the college campus.
7. Punitive mesure will be initiated against a student of the college if he/she uses the platform of **Social Media** to abuse/ scold/afront students/ faculty members/ others and he/she will face **Legal Action**.
8. Students having two wheeler should have **Driving License**. They will not be allowed to enter the College Campus without **Helmet** and relevant papers of their vehicle.

- Charcoal Grey Formal Trousers; White Shirts (Full Sleeves), and Black Formal Shoes with rubber sole, in summer and in winter they shall add on a matching dark blue tie with small star prints and navy blue blazer.

### **Uniform for H. S. Students**

**Boys:** White Shirt with navy blue strip on pocket and the Logo on chest, Navy Blue formal trousers, Rubber sole black formal shoe..

**Girls:** White Mekhela, White Chador with Navy Blue border (pari) and White blouse with college Logo on shoulder, Rubber sole black pump shoe. *Or* White Salwar Kameez with navy blue strip on hands and College Logo on shoulder, Navy Blue Dopatta Rubber sole black pump shoe.

### **Attendance Rules**

- Every student is required to attend all classes (lectures /tutorials /practical).
- A student must have 75% attendance to be eligible as a regular candidate to appear in the H. S. Final examinations.
- A student who attends 60% of the classes shall however be allowed to appear in the examination as non collegiate candidate on payment of a prescribed non-collegiate fee. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the H.S. examination with attendance below 60% in theory classes.
- A student must attend all practical classes and perform all experiments as required under the regulations of the AHSEC.
- A student who attends less than 80% of the classes shall not be allowed to appear in the election of the Students' Union.

Students on the basis of Merit cum Means and to the students belonging to SC and ST communities may be awarded scholarships by the government. Apart from that, *D.S.T. Inspire Award* is given to the deserving students of the college by the concerned authorities.

**Annexure - IV**

**UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009**

(Under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)

**F.1-16/2007(CPPII)**

**PREAMBLE**

**Dated 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2009**

In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of 'University of Kerala v/s. Council, Principals, Colleges and others' in SLP no. 24295 of 2006 dated 16.05.2007 and that dated 8.05.2009 in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student. With or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institutions in the country, and thereby, to provide for the healthy development, physically and psychologically, of all students, the University Grants Commission, in consultation with the Councils, brings forth this Regulation.


In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause(g) of Sub section (I) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following Regulations, namely;

**Below is an extract of some of the relevant clauses.**

**Clause 3.** What constitutes Ragging: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.

- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
  - g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it ; sexual abuse ,homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
  - h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
  - i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

**Clause 7.** Action to be taken by the Head of the institution.-On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i Abetment to ragging;
- ii Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- iii Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iv. Public nuisance created during ragging;
- v. Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- vi. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- vii Wrongful restraint;
- viii Wrongful confinement;
- ix. Use of criminal force;
- x. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- xi Extortion;
- xii Criminal trespass;
- xiii Offences against property;
- xiv. Criminal intimidation;
- xv. Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvi Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offence against the victim(s);
- xvii Physical or psychological humiliation;

xviii All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'.

Provided that the Head of the institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution.

Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police / local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

**Clause 9. Administrative action in the event of ragging.-**

9.1 The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punish or mentor otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in their commendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:
  1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
  2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
  3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
  4. Withholding results.
  5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
  6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
  7. Cancellation of admission.
  8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
  9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
  - i. In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University;
  - ii. In case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor.

iii. In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.
